**Description:** This volume consists of 143 documents arranged in six sections. A further 138 letters and reports for the year 1906 are bound into E-2.22; Diverse Akten über die Kamerunmission-miscellaneous documents concerning the work of the Mission in Cameroon, Documents 1-8; Mostly correspondence concerning proofs asked for by the Kolonialamt for the maltreatment of Cameroonians by German colonial troops; No. 1: A German army pharmacist, one Bernegen on the importance of the Cameroonian cola-nut for the world market (copy); No. 2: Judge Straehler in Berlin asks for the presence of Lutz as witness in a disciplinary hearing against Governor von Puttkamer; Ausschuss der Kamerunmission: letters and reports from the Mission's Local Executive Committee and its members, Documents 9-76; No. 10: Lutz mentions von Puttkamer's recall and the arrival of a new Governor Müller. And indeed a number of letters by both Lutz and Stolz are concerned with relationships with the new Governor. No. 69: a speech in their defence by Stolz; No. 70: Stolz, Father, Hippert and Bender of the Baptist mission petition the Governor on their behalf; No. 76: Annual report of the Basel Mission's Inspector of Schools, Dinkelacker; Bonaku: letters and reports from the Station at Bonaku, Documents 77-111; No 111: Deibol in his Annual Report tells stories about the perception of the power of God in his congregation; Bonaberi: letters and reports from the Station at Bonaberi, Documents 112-125; No. 117: Bufe comparing the education of freed slaves in Americ with schooling in Cameroon on the need for cultural education; Bombe: letters and reports from the Station at Bombe, Documents 126-131; No. 126a: a journey to Marue by Maier; No. 131: Gloeckel, a teacher in the Boys' Boarding School compares his work in the "bush" with the work in Duala and Togo; Mangamba: letters and reports from the Station at Mangamba, Documents 132-143; No. 133: Vöhringer on a journey to the Babon people; No. 143: Annual Report on the Wuri-Bodiman-Yabassi area, with the rules and regulations for mission work in the Wuri district
