**Description:** 62 documents divided into 12 sections, and for each station; Bonaku Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Bonaku, Documents 1-18; Includes a report by Dr Haeblerlin on his medical work; No. 7: A Cameroonian, Samuel Jenge, reports the execution of three men in Buea for sorcery; No. 12: Deibol's Annual Report is written in the Duala language; Bonaberi: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Bonaberi, Documents 19-21; No. 20: in his Annual Report Hecklinger mentions the expropriation of the Station by the Government. See also Nos. E-2.23,11. 35, 70-73 and 81; Bombe: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Bombe, Documents 22 and 23; No. 22: Maier on the losango secret society in Balong; No. 23: in his Annual Report Maier mentions the economic Situation of the people in this area; Mangamba: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Mangamba, Documents 24-27; No. 26: Ebding's Annual Report on the Wuri area and Yabassa area mentions plans for mission or parish plantations; No. 27: Bärtschi reports on work in schools, including handicrafts teaching, new patterns and techniques; Nyasoso: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Nyasoso, Documents 28-30; No. 29: Lorch on the Bakaka area and on the wish for teachers as protection against colonial troops; Lobethal: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Lobethal, Documents 31-32; Edea: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Edea, Documents 33-34; No. 34: Schürle mentions meeting members of a pigmy tribe near Nyong; He only met men - the women had been hidden for fear of him as a European. He also mentions how people are being forced to work on white plantations; Sakbayeme: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Sakbayeme, Documents 35-42; Victoria: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station in Victoria, Documents 43-45; No. 44: includes handwritten regulations for the YMCA in Victoria; Buea: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Buea, Documents 46-50; No. 46: Gutbrod reports on the visit of two German nobles, the Grossherzog of Mecklenberg-Schwerin and the Erbgrossherzog of Mecklenberg Strelitz. See also No. 49; Bali: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Bali, Documents 51-56; No. 55: Dorsch mentions the war against the Bafut people and the recall to Bafut of the Fon, who had been banished to the coast by the Government; Bamum: Quarterly and Annual Reports from the Station at Bamum, Documents 57-62; No. 58: Göhring reports on the introduction of the Christian Sunday to Bamum with the support of the King and of the German PC at Bamenda
